ACADEMICS

Students can choose to build their Study Plan by selecting courses from two curricula:

- Cattolica University Academic Curriculum
- Cattolica International Curriculum

Before applying participants should be aware of the Programme Requirements found here.

Applicants for <u>Cattolica courses taught in Italian</u> must provide an <u>Italian Language Proficiency Report</u> indicating a minimum proficiency level of B2. The report needs to be completed both by the student and an Italian language instructor and be uploaded during enrolment. Applicants that cannot provide the Italian Language Proficiency Report upon enrolment or those who, upon enrolment, do not meet the proficiency level of B2 are required to enrol in Pre-session intensive and/or Semester Italian Language Course.

Note that applicants for <u>Cattolica courses taught in English</u> who are non-native speakers must provide evidence of B2 or equivalent English language proficiency. Example of minimum requirements: TOEFL iBT 79, IELTS 6, Cambridge B2 First (FCE), or comparable certification. An English Language Proficiency Report is not required if a student has successfully completed a degree programme taught in English; or is currently studying in English at his/her home institution.

The University is planning to offer in-person teaching at 100% capacity in the Fall depending on the state of the pandemic, in which case the university may need to reinstate campus access restrictions.

All students coming to Cattolica for the 2022 Fall Semester will be expected to follow any protocol that might be in place and adhere to any rules regarding in-person class attendance and campus access.

Notably:

- 1. The School of Economics (Undergraduate and Graduate degrees) runs on a Trimester System. Please take note of the following course schedule:
- Trimester 1: mid-September mid-December (Including mid-term and final exams)
 Trimester 2: beginning of January beginning of April (Including mid-term and final exams)
- Trimester 3: beginning of April End of July (Including mid-term and final exams)

If students coming in Spring choose courses belonging to Trimester 2, they will be required to follow classes from January and they **must attend orientation** scheduled on January 5, 2023.

2. Courses belonging to the School of Banking, Insurance and Finance and the Interfaculty: Economics + Banking, Insurance and Finance will start on September 12 2022.

Academic Notes

The home institution sets the policy regarding the award of credits for coursework completed at Cattolica. Students are responsible for knowing their home institution's policies and procedures regarding this matter.

Cattolica Academic Curriculum:

- Students can take classes from LAUREA TRIENNALE (undergraduate) and LAUREA MAGISTRALE (graduate courses)
- Students can take classes from all Faculties/Departments
- Note that the Faculty of Law, Political Sciences, Education and Languages offers mostly year-long courses
- Students are advised to enrol in the Italian language course as most classes and exams are entirely run in Italian
- Students will not have to register for courses prior to the beginning of classes; they will be required to update and confirm their Study Plan later during the semester and register online via their iCatt personal page for examinations
- Course attendance is strongly recommended but not always mandatory.
- Students may choose from three possible final examination dates for most of the courses; however, the Faculty of Economics in English has only two possible final examination dates per each session.

Academic Notes

The home institution sets the policy regarding the award of credits for coursework completed at Cattolica. Students are responsible for knowing their home institution's policies and procedures regarding this matter.

Cattolica International Curriculum:

- The International Curriculum courses are elective courses within the Facoltà di Scienze Linguistiche e Letterature Straniere degree course. Elective courses account for 6 ECTS and 44 contact hours.
- Erasmus+ students can select only <u>ONE course</u> from the International Curriculum and will earn their remaining credits from the Academic Curriculum Courses in order to satisfy their home institution course load requirements
- Students will be asked to pay an activity registration fee of 45 € (except for students admitted through Direct-Enrolment).
- Non-E.U. students taking courses within the International Curriculum usually enrol in 4 area courses and 1 Italian Language course (pre-session intensive or semester Italian Language course)
- Students will receive all the information related to course schedules and registration instructions before the beginning of classes
- Students will be required to register for courses online. Detailed information will be sent directly to students on this matter. The registration for courses will be on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Students will be required to attend courses regularly. Most courses feature one midterm and one final examination (other forms of assessment may be used and may vary depending on the course).

If students do not select these options during their enrolment, they will not have the opportunity to choose them after. Please make students aware if any of these options are not approved by you (and therefore not available as part of their exchange or study abroad benefits).

STUDY ABROAD IMPACT LAB

The Study Abroad Impact Lab is a 5-step special content workshop designed to maximise the study abroad experience and focus on building the skills needed to land one's dream job. Study Abroad Impact Lab, is led by a faculty member and professionals, and consists of 5 workshops which will cover the following topics:

- cross-cultural competencies
- skills to complement a CV

- personal brand management

Duration of internship placements: 2-6 months.

Internship requests for a duration of less than 2 months will be assessed on a case-by-case basis.

SERVICE-LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

Service Learning / Volunteering Abroad opportunities are offered in education and language training. The placement will be carried out in schools where the languages taught may be English, German, Spanish, French. Students will be asked to attend the school two or three times weekly for a total of 4-6 hours per week, however the schedule may vary according to each school's needs. Some classes may also occur online and not in-person.

PRE-SESSION INTENSIVE ITALIAN LANGUAGE COURSES

The intensive Italian language course will be offered **in person** as of Fall 2022 and will not be made available for remote participation. Presession intensive Italian language courses are offered before the beginning of each semester. The courses are recommended for all students but not compulsory. Pre-session language courses are offered at an additional cost (see table below). **Students must select the course while completing the enrolment in Cattolica students' enrolment portal.**

Level of instruction: from Absolute Beginner to Advanced.

Course Description: the pre-session intensive Italian Language course consists of 44 hours (45 minutes each) over 2 weeks (6 ECTS credits). Once registered, students will take an online placement test and an online interview to assess their level. This also applies to absolute beginners.

SEMESTER ITALIAN LANGUAGE COURSES

The semester Italian language course will be offered **in person** as of Fall 2022 and will not be made available for remote participation. Semester Italian language courses are offered throughout the semester and in conjunction with the other academic courses. The courses are recommended for all students but not compulsory. Semester language courses are fee-paying courses (see table below). **Students must select the course while completing the enrolment in Cattolica students' enrolment portal.**

Level of instruction: from Absolute Beginner to Advanced, depending on the number of applicants.

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

Cattolica International will organize an on-campus Orientation Event at the beginning of the semester. Cattolica strongly encourages students to take part in the event.

The 3-day Orientation Event programme consists of:

Day 1 (Tuesday morning/afternoon): Welcome speech and ESN presentation;

Day 2 (Wednesday morning/afternoon): Info session on Cattolica International Curriculum and Cattolica Academic Curriculum;

Day 3 (Thursday morning/afternoon): Italian Language course presentation and Q&A info session

During the orientation students will be informed on campus services and how to organize their course schedule and select courses.

ENROLMENT FEE

As part of their enrolment, all students are required to pay a mandatory non-refundable fee of € 80 (This fee is included in the tuition fee for Direct Enrolment students where Payment is made by the University).

The benefits included in the enrolment fee are:

- 1) Student ID card that can also function as bank card
- 2) Health and liability insurance (see below MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS/ HEALTH SERVICES for more details)

TRAVEL INFORMATION

There are 3 Airports in Milan and the surrounding areas.

- Malpensa International Airport, 40 Km from Milan City Centre.

Connected by the Malpensa Express trains which run to Cadorna Station and Milan Central Station every 30 minutes, single ride ticket € 13.

- Milan Linate Airport, 6 km from Milan City Centre.

Connected by bus 73 from outside the airport to San Babila metro station (Red line/MM1 line) in the Centre of Milan.

- Bergamo Orio al Serio Airport, 54 Km from Milan Central Station.

Connected by various buses (e.g., Orioshuttle, Terravision) from outside the airport which run to Milan Central station where you can find Metro lines MM2 (green line) and MM3 (yellow line). Average ticket price: €10

Milan metro/underground system: Single ticket €2.00 (valid for 90 minutes from validation)

To reach Cattolica International department by Metro, (Via Carducci 30) You can take the Red line MM1: stop at Cadorna Station and walk 10 minutes, or take the Green line MM2: stop at S.Ambrogio Station and walk 5 minutes. The Cattolica International department (Via Carducci, 30) is 5 minutes walking distance from the main campus (Largo Gemelli, 1).

Should students decide to commute by taxi from Malpensa International Airport or Bergamo Orio al Serio to Milan City Centre the cost will be around 110 €. Taxis from Linate cost around €25 to Milan city centre.

COVID-19 information for travellers:

We recommend students are aware of travel rules and frequently consult the website **VIAGGIARESICURI**: **http://www.viaggiaresicuri.it/** where all the information on travelling and entering Italy is listed. Students must be aware that

according to their country of origin or if they are stopping in other countries while travelling to Italy they may be subjected to specific restrictions.

Specific updates and guidelines will be communicated to enrolled students prior to the beginning of the semester/academic year with reference to the Italian context to make sure all the interested students are aware of the guidelines and prescriptions to observe in the Country. Movement among Italian regions may be limited if not prohibited according to COVID-19 restrictive measures to contain the pandemic.

ACCOMMODATION/ HOUSING

HOUSING

Cattolica offers some accommodation options via a third-party provider, MIL Service, where places are limited.

Type of housing provided: Off-campus shared apartment or shared/single dorm room with bathroom. For more information please check the MIL Service website: http://www.milservice.com/.

Admitted students will receive communications and reminders about housing throughout the pre-arrival process.

Note for Students admitted via Direct-Enrolment: housing benefits begin on the official date of arrival and last until the end of the placement period inclusive of all examination and vacation periods between academic sessions. Housing costs will be included in the request of payment.

MEALS

Students may have access to the campus cafeteria. As enrolled students, participants will have access to the student discounted rate of €7.70 (full meal) or €5.00 (light meal).

MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS/ HEALTH SERVICES

Non-EU residents must take out an International Health Insurance, which covers costs related to medical treatment and admission to hospital and importantly medical evacuation and repatriation to their home country. Additionally, as part of their enrolment, all E.U. and Non-E.U. students are required to adhere to the University's health and safety programme (Student Safety Package) for the entire duration of enrolment, which is an additional health insurance and personal liability coverage that is complementary to the international health coverage the students secure prior to their arrival in Italy. Since Cattolica is unable to verify the coverage and policies of every international student, it applies this blanket policy to all students to ensure that every student has a minimum required coverage. Additionally, the University requires a personal liability insurance that most international health insurance policies do not include. This coverage is only activated for the exact duration of the students' programme at Cattolica, so it may not cover any travel dates to Italy before the start of the programme, or any travel that the students may do after the end of their programme. We therefore recommend that students nonetheless enrol in any health insurance that their home university requires or at least for some additional travel health insurance that covers their travel dates outside of their programme dates.

Under normal circumstances, should students need medical assistance, they can turn to the University Health Center. Depending on the state of the pandemic in the Fall, students will still be encouraged, in case of suspected COVID infection, not to go the University Health Center but to follow local health authority protocols if applicable. Students will be given information on protocols to follow should the pandemic situation warrant it.

GREEN PASS (EU Covid Certificate)

Currently, students who wish to access the University must show proof of vaccination, of recovery from COVID, or a negative test result. In addition to the EU Covid-19 certificate (or "Green Pass" in Italy), per ministerial guidelines, the University also accepts most non–EU certifications that show proof of vaccination with an EMA approved vaccine. The requirement to demonstrate the Green Pass at Università Cattolica and in the rest of Italy is subject to Government guidelines.

ESTIMATED PERSONAL EXPENSES

In addition to room and board, students are responsible for all additional personal expenses.

VISA FOR NON - EU STUDENTS

Non-EU students are required to apply for a study visa. Once enrolled, students will receive two admission letters (in English and in Italian) to be submitted to the Italian Consulate/Embassy, along with the study visa application.

If students apply for their study visa independently, they will need to do so via the "Universitaly" portal (https://www.universitaly.it/index.php/dashboard). However, if the Home University processes the visa applications in batches, the above procedure is not necessary.

TRANSCRIPT ISSUANCE

Procedure to ensure timely processing of transcripts: students need to close their career online through iCatt (the Cattolica students personal page) prior to their departure or once they have received all the grades relevant to the completion of their academic career. Additionally, students can download a self-certification which reports their academic career as provisional Transcript of Records from their iCatt page. This document cannot substitute the official Transcript of Records issued by Università Cattolica to the students' home University. Students who take late exams may experience some delay in receiving transcripts. Please notify International Student Services of any home institution deadlines for receiving transcripts for graduation, etc.

The final Transcript of Records is issued only at the end of the study period at Cattolica.
